COURAGE AND SACRIFICE

When Secretary of War Stimson recently opened the U.S. Army to voluntary enlistment by citizens of Japanese ancestry, more than simply an opportunity to serve the nation on the fields of battle was opened to us. For on that momentous occasion there were placed in our hands the means by which we could prove to the world that some of us, the Japanese American people, are willing to give their very blood and life as evidence of our hope and desire to have our future generations live as respected American citizens.

In the short space of these present weeks the greatest opportunity and test of our generation confront us. Some of us will choose to serve America in fields other than on the combat fronts of the United Nations. Others will place their lives at the disposal of the United States by volunteering to become parts of the armed forces. For the latter especially, no tribute that the rest of the Japanese American people or the nation can possibly give will be too great.

These youths will be subjecting themselves to the perils of military life because they hold the firm conviction that they are providing greater grounds on which the Japanese American people now and in the future could fight and strive to find a decent and respected place in the life of America.

The future will bring out the positive realization of how much is owed to the courage and sacrifice of these few young men.
